You select one, take it home, turn it into a work of art, then bring it back for display in front of the Police Department.

Please! Only take the pumpkins if you plan to participate in the display.

Pick them up in front of City Hall starting on Thursday, 10/25. Bring them back starting Monday, 10/29.

We will light them up so there is no need for you to supply candles.



### Trick-or-Treat at the Police Department

On Halloween night, when you have your costume on, come on up to the Police Department to enjoy the pumpkin display and to trick-or-treat.

### Safe Trick-or-Treating

- ◆ Only give and accept wrapped or packaged candy. Examine all candy before it is eaten.
- ◆ Make sure children can see well through face masks, or use cosmetics, rather than a mask, to create fun or scary faces.
- ◆ Adults should accompany young children; always carry a flashlight.
- ◆ Wear light-colored clothing short enough to prevent tripping, or, consider adding reflective tape to your costume.
- ◆ Keep costumed children away from pets as they may not recognize the child and become frightened.
- ◆ Watch out for traffic. Stay on the shoulder or sidewalk.

## Beware of Scams

The Clyde Hill Police have recently become aware of several telephone scams in our area. Some examples are:

- Jury duty
- IRS liens
- Failure to pay taxes
- Threats to release damaging information about you or have you arrested
- Injured family members or family members in jail

Remember, any caller who demands immediate payment via wire transfer or gift cards is not legitimate – this is a scam!

Law enforcement, government agencies, and courts do not call people and demand money or threaten to arrest you. Unfortunately, it is relatively cheap and easy to make a phone call appear to come from anywhere – even from the police! This is called spoofing, and due to the anonymity of the internet and the fact that many of the scammers are out of state or even out of the country, there isn't much that police can do to catch them. These criminals are looking for easy victims and they will move on when you don't fall for their scams.

We recommend letting calls from unfamiliar or unidentified numbers go to voicemail, and blocking known scam numbers. Feel free to stop by the Police Department or call 425-454-7187 during normal business hours if you have any questions about telephone scams.

### Rainwater and the Storm System

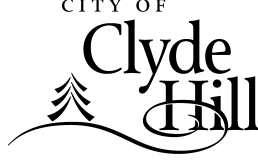
