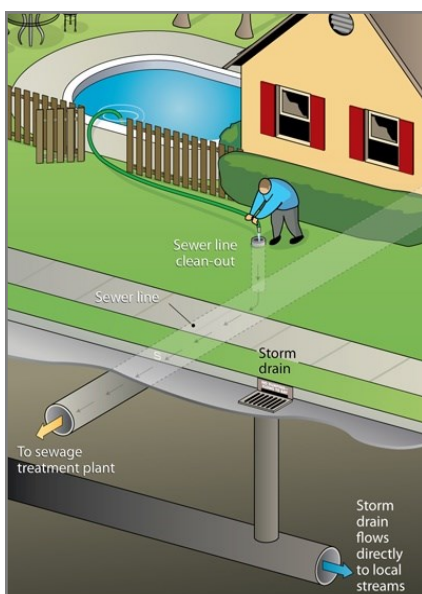
Safe Trick-or-Treating

- ◆ Only give and accept wrapped or packaged candy. Examine all candy before it is eaten.
- ◆ Make sure children can see well through face masks, or use cosmetics to create fun or scary faces.
- ◆ Adults should accompany young children; carry a flashlight.
- ◆ Wear light-colored clothing short enough to prevent tripping or consider adding reflective tape to your costume.
- ◆ Keep costumed children away from pets as they may not recognize the child and become frightened.
- ◆ Watch out for traffic. Stay on the shoulder or sidewalk.

Swimming Pools: Draining and Fencing

Pool Draining: Did you know that it is illegal to drain your swimming pool into the storm system?

Most people don't realize that the storm system flows directly into local creeks and Lake Washington. Pool water can contain chemicals that are harmful to plants and animals in local waters.



If you need to drain your pool, make sure to drain it into a sanitary sewer line, not into a storm system grate or onto the street. Chapter 13.10 of the Municipal Code contains details about discharging hazardous wastes.

Pool Fencing: Clyde Hill has strict pool fencing rules in order to protect against the danger of drowning. Please refer to Chapter 17.48 of the Municipal Code for all the details. The code says, in part, that pools need to be completely surround by at least a five foot high constructed fence (a residence may be part of the fence) with a flat surface on the outside to prevent a person easily climbing it and no crawl space below.

If you happen to see her out and about, don't be afraid to say hello and to welcome her to the City!

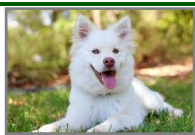
The Rain is Coming!!

Corner Visibility



It's that time of year again! City staff will be inspecting intersections to determine if vegetation needs to be trimmed back. The purpose of this annual undertaking is to increase safety by making sure one can see adequately around corners.

If City staff determines that your corner vegetation needs to be trimmed back, you will be sent a letter and provided 14 days to perform the work (*City staff will be available to meet with you beforehand*) or, alternatively, you can just sit tight and allow City staff to take care of it.

Change Your Smoke Alarm Batteries

Each year, thousands of people die in house fires nationwide, and many of these deaths occur in homes without a working smoke alarm.

To help avoid these needless tragedies we urge you to adopt a simple life-saving habit:



Change out smoke alarm and carbon monoxide detector batteries when clocks are changed in the spring and fall.
