Deadline for Potential Amendments to City's Zoning Code and Comprehensive Plan

The City's municipal code (CHMC) provides a once-a-year opportunity to submit proposals for changes to the development code and the Comprehensive Plan.

Title 17—Zoning

City of Clyde Hill
2015-2015 Comprehensive Plan

CHMC 19.08.010: The purpose of this chapter is to establish the type of action and procedures for suggesting amendments and encouraging public participation for comprehensive plan and development regulation amendments.

Fall City Maintenance



Now that fall has arrived, the City of Clyde Hill's Public Works Department is requesting the support of residents to help keep the streets, sidewalks and catch basins clear of fallen leaves.


The potential for street flooding is greatly increased when catch basins are clogged with leaves and debris. Municipal Code Section 13.10.010 prohibits the sweeping or depositing of leaves along the gutter of the street or in the roadway.

If you notice that a catch basin is not functioning properly, we ask that you safely remove any possible obstruction. If you feel that a situation is unsafe, please contact the Public Works Department for assistance. Do not remove the grate from the catch basin.

To prevent potential flooding issues in your neighborhood, residents are encouraged to collect and dispose of yard waste through one of the following ways:

- Whenever possible, mow over your leaves to create mulch. This will greatly reduce the amount of fallen leaves to clean up and help fertilize the lawn at the same time. Do not blow or dispose of leaves on to the municipal rights-of-way, as this can cause hazardous traffic conditions.
- Residents that have yard service are asked to remind yard care providers that yard debris must be placed in proper waste bins.

And remember, do not put anything (other than rain) down the storm drain...it goes directly to Lake Washington.



Opening on the Planning Commission



City code requires that living fences (hedges) be trimmed to eight feet or lower. Please plan to maintain your hedges on a regular schedule; once they get overgrown it is much more difficult to trim them down and, once trimmed, they often won't look very nice.
