### **Republic Services Spring Clean-up Event**

The Spring Clean-Up Event will soon be here!

This yearly event allows you to put out, for pick-up, all kinds of

unwanted items not normally allowed, such as extra garbage, furniture, yard waste, lumber, electronic equipment, small appliances, etc.

This event will occur on either Thursday, April 19th or Friday, April 20th (on your regularlyscheduled garage pick-up day.)

Items you MAY NOT put out include: hazardous wastes (such as paint and pesticides; see the box below for handling these), large appliances (such as refrigerators), liquid wastes and tires.

### **2018 Construction Projects**

During the course of 2018 there will be three large construction projects taking place in Clyde Hill.

### 20<sup>th</sup> Street Overlay:

Starting at the end of March, NE 20<sup>th</sup> Street (from 84<sup>th</sup> to 92<sup>nd</sup> as well as 89th from 20th to the cul-de-sac) will be overlaid with new pavement. Residents in the nearby area should expect delays during this time.

### 84<sup>th</sup> Avenue Improvements:

Between April and November, 84<sup>th</sup> Ave will be under construction. New sidepaths, drainage, landscape, fences, and traffic signals will be installed during this time. The project will conclude with the roadway being overlaid with new pavement. Residents of the nearby area should expect significant delays during this time.

### Clyde Hill Elementary School:

Between June 2018 and July 2019 the Clyde Hill Elementary School will be demolished and rebuilt. Included in this project are new ingress/egress routes for the replacement school. Residents of the nearby area should expect delays during this time.

### Republic Services Recycling Information: Curbside & Hazardous Waste

Have you ever been unsure about what to do with your old printer, spent batteries or used cooking oil? Clyde Hill customers have expanded recycling service options from Republic Services. If you haven't been able to find a second life for your unwanted items, Republic Services will take difficult-to-recycle items them for reuse and recycling.

### **Curbside collection:**

Please place all items next to the recycle cart.

- Fluorescent tubes & bulbs (limit 2 tubes/bulbs per visit,10 per year)
- Tubes: Wrap in paper and secure with tape; no longer than 4 ft.
- Bulbs: Place inside closed plastic bags.
- Household Batteries: Place rechargeable and non-rechargeable batteries in separate, clear, sealed bags.
- Used Cooking Oil: Seal uncontaminated oil (no large solids) in clean, clear, screw-top, plastic jugs. Label jugs with name and address. Limit 3 gallons per drop off and 10 gallons per year.
- Scrap Metal: All ferrous and non-ferrous scrap metal, including lids 3in or larger, that are free of wood, plastic, rubber, and other contaminants.

### Call for pick up:

Please call (206) 682-9730 at least three days prior to your collection day for curbside pickup of these items:

- · Textiles: Place clean, dry clothing and household textiles in clear plastic
- Small Appliances and Electronics (2ft x 2ft x 2ft or smaller and less than 60 pounds). Accepted items include: computer equipment, audio equipment, TVs, cell phones, microwaves, toaster ovens, irons, etc.
- Large Scrap Metal

### Drop off:

Republic Services Drop-Off Center is located at: 1600 127th Ave NE

They accept everything listed in the boxes to the left, plus:

Styrofoam Blocks: place Styrofoam in a clear plastic bag. No packing peanuts.

> Drop-off hours: Monday—Friday 8am-5pm

Curbside: When you put items in the recycling container, make sure they're Empty, Clean and Dry. It is also important to keep your recycling dry. One of the best ways to keep recycling dry is to make sure the lid is closed. If you see a container lid open, please help out by closing it! Closed lids also help keep recycling inside your container on windy days and prevent birds from pulling items from open containers.

Wet paper isn't recyclable: Rain ruins recyclable material, often making it no longer recyclable. If you have cardboard, break it down and put it in your recycling container or wait until a non-rainy day to place beside your recycling cart. Wet recycling is really heavy: Wet loads are heavy loads, and are much more stressful on your local streets.

Hazardous Wastes: Hazardous wastes are products that contain ingredients that are toxic, flammable, reactive or corrosive. These include paint thinner, fluorescent lights, pesticides and car batteries. If disposed of improperly, these products can be harmful to humans, wildlife and the environment. Proper disposal prevents household hazardous waste from entering the environment; damaging soil, groundwater and streams; or causing harm to people and animals. You can drop off hazardous wastes at the Factoria Collection Shed, or drop them off at the travelling Wastemobile: https://kingcounty.gov/depts/dnrp/solid-waste/facilities/hazardous-waste.aspx
