

How to prepare your recyclables:

- · No food waste, liquid, or plastic bags.
- · DO NOT bag recyclables; leave loose (except where noted).
- · Put additional recyclables in sturdy bins, boxes, large paper bags, or 32-gal cans marked "Recycle" next to your recycling cart; not to exceed 60lbs each.


