Commuter Parking

In response to the concerns of Clyde Hill residents, new parking restrictions have been placed in and around the pick-up and drop-off transit facility ("Kiss & Ride") at 92nd & Points Drive.



The new restrictions are a mixture of no-parking and limited-parking areas. These new restrictions will help to increase pedestrian as well as driver safety while promoting the intended use of the Kiss & Ride, WHICH is, a drop-off and pick-up only area.

Remember that Metro Route 246 can be accessed on 24th and 92nd to take you to/from the 92nd Kiss & Ride.

The Clyde Hill PD Sentinel

A new service is available from the Clyde Hill Police Department - The Police Department will be sending out informational posts known as the CHPD Sentinel.

The Sentinel is an attempt, on a weekly basis, to share factual information on the more intrusive and serious offenses that occur in the City. Our hope is that by providing this information, our citizens can become better informed, increase the security of their homes, and increase awareness of activity in their neighborhoods.

In addition, the Sentinel will serve as a crime alert system should we have a developing trend. Information on Crime Prevention, Emergency Preparedness, and some behind the scenes activities of your Police Department will also be shared.

24th/84th Ave Project

Traffic engineers hired jointly by Clyde Hill and Medina are currently in the process of finalizing the design of 84th, north of 24th. This design will include a new traffic signal that will be used to facilitate better management of traffic in Clyde Hill, a dedicated northbound bike lane, a shared southbound bike lane, new street pavement and improved drainage. Construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2017.

LED Street Lights

In August, Puget Sound Energy will be replacing all of the Clyde Hill streetlights with LED fixtures.

Residents will notice an improvement in the color of the light and the visibility in the surrounding area.

While current fixtures produce a yellow hue, the new LED fixtures will produce a more accurate clear hue. This grant funded project will save money and increase safety, as LED fixtures use about 30% less electricity while producing light that enables objects to be seen more clearly.
