Lisa enjoys rock climbing, traveling the world with friends, and spending time with her fur babies, Luna and Ellington.



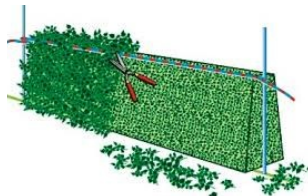
Neighborhood Beauty

As you all know, Clyde Hill is a beautiful and desirable neighborhood to live in. Please help keep it that way by knowing and following the rules.



Boats, RVs, Trailers: These types of vehicles may only be parked for a maximum of 48 hours on private property; essentially for cleaning, loading and unloading.

Landscapes: Please, respect the beauty of this amazing neighborhood *and* your neighbors by maintaining your landscapes; mow, trim, pull weeds. Living fences must be trimmed down to eight-feet or lower.



Storage Pods: Permits are required to locate a storage pod on private property. Limitations apply.

Dog Doo: Please clean up after your dog and throw away the trash bag properly.

Noise Hours: Leaf blowers and construction noise are allowed between 7am and 6pm on weekdays, and 10am and 4pm on weekends and holidays.

A message from Mayor Klaas:

68 years ago, our city was incorporated (March 31, 1953). It has grown into a beautiful and peaceful community. Clyde Hill Stormwater

Storm drainage systems are designed to decrease the chance of flooding in areas that have been developed with homes, businesses, and roads. The rainwater that used to seep into vegetated areas now must be collected and carried elsewhere. The storm drainage system collects this storm water runoff and carries it to the nearest wetland, lake, stream, or to Puget Sound. In urban areas the storm drainage system consists of drains and underground pipes. Storm drains are normally located in streets and parking lots. In rural areas the storm drainage system may be in the form of ditches that carry the stormwater along a roadside or piece of property. These drainage systems are meant to carry only unpolluted stormwater to the nearest natural body of water.

Putting oil, antifreeze, detergents, and other material into the storm drainage system is the same as dumping them directly into a lake or stream.



Buses in Clyde Hill

In March, the City was informed that normal services had resumed along almost all of its bus routes. Metro #271 and Sound Transit #542 and #545 appear to be functioning on relatively normal schedules. Metro #246 is still suspended. As this might change, users of these services are advised to periodically check with these mass transit agencies.



Planning Commission

The Planning Commission is currently in the process of performing a comprehensive review and update of the City's Land Use Code. Among other topics, this includes signs, flags/flagpoles, illumination, and accessory structures. This is a long process that is set to take place through the end of the year and possibly include new sections of Code. Though the City's Land Use Code has been revised and added to in the past, a comprehensive review has not been undertaken since the City's initial incorporation and has the potential to have long-lasting impact for its residents for years to come, if not generations.
