Our no-contact holiday food drive starts next week! Unfortunately, Hopelink was unable to partner with us this year due to COVID restrictions. We're happy to announce that we will be partnering with Jubilee Reach instead. Since March, Jubilee Reach has been focusing on pandemic relief by providing families with necessary everyday items, including pet items to keep furry family members fed too!

There are two ways to participate:

1) Drop off at the police station next Monday-Friday, 8:30am-5:00pm * 11/16 - 11/20

To keep this no contact, there will be a large plastic bin just outside the police station for you to put your donation. Staff will be emptying and cleaning the bin throughout the day.

2) Drive through/drop off next Saturday, 9:00am-12:00pm in the Clyde Hill Elementary parking lot * 11/21

Staff will be on hand to unload your donation.

The next time you're grocery shopping, consider picking up some of these items. **High priority items are highlighted.**

Food

- Canned meat (*tuna, chicken, salmon*)
- **Dry beans/lentils**
- Fruit (*canned or dried*)
- **Grains (*pasta, rice, quinoa, barley, etc.*)**
- Nut butter (*peanut butter, almond butter, etc.*)
- Canned vegetables
- Healthy pre-packaged snacks
- **Cooking oil (*large size*)**

Non-Food

- Baby items (***diapers sizes newborn-6, wipes***, formula)
- Personal hygiene items (*toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, soap, deodorant, razor, comb, brush*)
- **Feminine hygiene items (*tampons, pads, liners*)**
- **Quart and gallon size zip-lock bags**
- Household/cleaning items (***paper towels, dish soap***, dishwasher detergent, ***laundry detergent pods***, toilet paper, etc.)

Pet

- **Cat litter**
- **Dry cat food**
- **Dry dog food**

Clothing

- **Children's winter coats** (gently used is fine)
- Hats
- Gloves
- Socks
