Safe Trick-or-Treating

- ◆ Only give and accept wrapped or packaged candy. Examine all candy before it is eaten.
- ◆ Make sure children can see well through face masks, or use cosmetics to create fun or scary faces.
- ◆ Adults should accompany young children; carry a flashlight.
- ◆ Wear light-colored clothing short enough to prevent tripping.
- ◆ Consider adding reflective tape to your costume.
- ◆ Keep costumed children away from pets as they may not recognize the child and become frightened.
- ◆ Watch out for traffic. Stay on the shoulder or sidewalk.

How to get an Officer Response

If you need a police officer—at any time—for any reason—**dial 911**.

Calling 911 is the only way to get an officer dispatched. To report suspicious activity or any issue requiring police response, dial 911.

The Clyde Hill Police office phone number is for administrative purposes only. Messages left on the office voicemail may not be received until the next business day.

- Do not leave valuables in plain sight, either in your home or in your car
- Get a locking mailbox

Medicine Take-Back Box

The Clyde Hill Police Department has a medicine drop box. You may drop off surplus or expired medication, no questions asked, during regular Police Department hours; Monday through Friday, 8:30am to 5:00pm.

There are some limitations: cosmetics, aerosols, and non-medical bulk items should not be deposited here. In addition, sharps such as hypodermic needles commonly used for diabetic care, are not collected or deposited at this site.

Beware of Phone Scams

We have received reports of scam phone calls regarding the IRS and jury duty. Government agencies will NOT contact you this way! Another common scam is a relative (especially a grandchild) in trouble.

If you receive a suspicious phone call, do NOT give out personal information or money over the phone, and hang up immediately. Do NOT go purchase gift cards and read them the card numbers.



If you are a victim of a telephone scam and you have lost money or have become a victim of identity theft, call 911 to file a police report.

Clyde Hill's Planning Commission is made up of City residents who serve in 6-year terms. Their role is to serve in an advisory capacity to the City Council on matters involving zoning, land use and long range planning. They meet on an

as-needed basis; not more than once per month, and usually less.

Threadcycle

Damaged clothes and linens aren't garbage anymore. Take them to a Threadcycle drop-off location.

Up to 95 percent of the clothes, shoes, and linens thrown in the garbage could have been re-used or recycled.
